## Flathead Indian Reservation Housing Needs Assessment

# Summary of Results

The Flathead Housing Coalition was established in 2021 to address the housing and health needs of all residents of the Flathead indian Reservation. The group includes the Salish and Kootenai Housing authority, the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes, and many of the cities, towns, and unincorporated communities on the Reservation. The Coalition collaborated to conduct the Needs Assesments and plans to continue work in housing and community development.









#### OVERCROWDING RATES






#### SELF-RATED HOUSING CONDITIONS

#### PREVALENCE OF HEALTHY HOUSING CONCERNS






