Nk'wúwilš (to become one) Solidarity Campaign



- The Salish and Kootenai people stewarded the lands around what is now Missoula for 12,000+ years.
- On the Flathead Reservation, there are currently ~250 Tribal households on the waiting list for 516 Low Rent units that are managed by the Salish & Kootenai Housing Authority.
- A bureaucratic funding gap prevents those who are currently in Low Rent housing from increasing their income and becoming homeowners.
- Relatively small amounts of money can allow these families to own their own homes.

Solidarity implies a broad sense of commitment to well-being.
