 The Salish and Kootenai people stewarded the lands around what is now Missoula for 12,000+ years.

- On the Flathead Reservation, there are currently ~250 Tribal households on the waiting list for 516 Low Rent units that are managed by the Salish & Kootenai Housing Authority.
- A bureaucratic funding gap prevents those who are currently in Low Rent housing from increasing their income and becoming homeowners.
- Relatively small amounts of money can allow these families to own their own homes.

People living in this area have an opportunity to participate in transformational solidarity to repair the harms of the past and move toward a future of greater harmony between peoples.
