 The Salish and Kootenai people stewarded the lands around what is now Missoula for 12,000+ years.

- On the Flathead Reservation, there are currently ~250 Tribal households on the waiting list for 516 low-income rental units that are managed by the Salish & Kootenai Housing Authority.
- A bureaucratic funding gap prevents those who are currently in low-income housing from increasing their income and becoming homeowners.
- Relatively small amounts of money can allow these families to own their own homes.
